Christmas reminds us that love is actually the foundation for everything we experience, indeed the world, the entire Universe depends on it. It was love that in the beginning motivated our creator God to scatter the stars and galaxies across the night sky. It was love that is at the heart of the creativity and artistry we see all around us in the wonders of nature and life. It is love which is behind the sustaining power of God which holds all of creation in existence.

We find in Jesus that God's love doesn't demand perfection of us, or even that we need to reach a certain goodness threshold before we qualify for his grace. Instead we discover that forgiveness and blessing
